

Working Through Breast Cancer

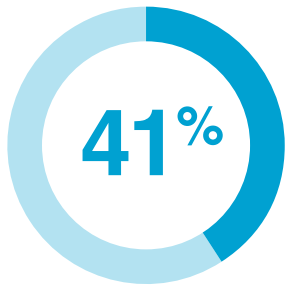
A 2014 survey of over 1,000 women with breast cancer* who have worked or looked for work since diagnosis (including 189 with metastatic disease) revealed: **77% of working women with breast cancer feel that working aids in their recovery**



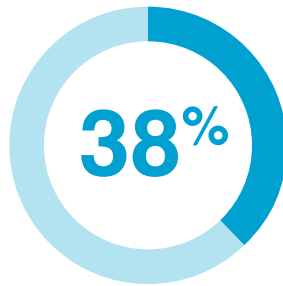
56% of women surveyed preferred to work - and not only because they need to.

*While income was the number one choice (59%), here are the other top reasons why:***

Work makes me
feel productive:



Work is personally
fulfilling:



I want things to feel
as normal as possible:



Working women with metastatic breast cancer were nearly **2x as likely** as those with early-stage breast cancer to cite the desire to feel normal as a reason for wanting to work
